




Ag Banquet

Dr. Graciela Andrango is originally from Cayambe, Ecuador but her family moved to Quito (Ecuador's capital) when she was young so that Graciela and her three sisters could attend better schools. Dr. Andrango received a Bachelor's in Agricultural Sciences from Zamorano University in Honduras. She then returned to Ecuador to work as an Extension Agent helping small-scale farmers market their products. Dr. Andrango then went to Kansas State where she completed a Masters and PhD in Agricultural Economics. In 2014, she returned to Ecuador to work for INIAP (Ecuador's equivalent of the USDA) researching how new varieties released by INIAP have impacted the livelihoods of smallscale farmers. Dr. Andrango joined the WIU School of Agriculture in January 2017. She teaches mostly agribusiness classes and coadvises the Ag Business Club. During her free time, Dr. Andrango enjoys talking with her family, watching movies, and watching documentaries, especially from the WWII era. She also enjoys working on puzzles of famous paintings. Dr. Andrango's parents are retired school teachers and live on the small farm in Cayambe where Graciela spent her summers as a child. They use organic practices to grow much of the food they eat - potatoes, corn, beans, and some Andean fruits.
