Staff Spotlight: Meet Dr. Shelby Henning!

Dr. Shelby Henning was born in South Africa and moved to the U.S. when he was seven. Dr. Henning received his B.S. in Forestry, M.S. in Plant Pathology (turfgrass), and Ph.D. in Soil Fertility/Fertilizer Use Efficiency (turfgrass). He obtained all of his degrees from the University of Illinois. Before coming to WIU, Dr. Henning ran a 100 acre off-campus agricultural research facility for the U of I in northern Illinois. He came to WIU just before the fall semester in 2017 as an Assistant Professor of Horticulture. At WIU, he also advises the Horticulture Club who are increasing their community involvement with service projects. This past school year the club helped plant trees as part of campus improvement efforts prior to Homecoming. Also the club helped plant a garlic variety trial with the Macomb Master Gardeners at the local Extension office last fall. Dr. Henning has very limited free time because he has four children ranging in ages from 5-13 that keep him on his toes. Also, it is his first year of teaching and has six classes to prepare for and teach.
