Learning Assessment (100 pts): A learning assessment will be constructed that represents a variety of methods (T/F, multiple choice, matching, essay, etc). Classroom handouts will be the criteria used to assess the assignment.

Incentive Grant (50 pts): Student will fill in activities associated with the Illinois ISBE incentive grant for agricultural education teachers.

Lesson Plans (50 pts each / 150 pts total): 2 lessons using the FB Ag Mags, 3rd & 5th lesson plans will be assigned, plus one green book lesson plan

Reflection Papers (50 pts each / 150 pts total): A reflection paper will be written after each lesson plan presented. Criteria used Principles of Teaching & Learning.

Midterm (100 pts): This evaluation will assess all topics covered to this point.

Final (100 pts): It will be a comprehensive final.

SAE Projects (100 pts each): Students will complete a business book on AET.

Teaching Calendar (50 pts): Students will construct a teaching calendar using My-Caert **Summer Calendar (60 pts):** Students will develop a summer calendar for the months of June, July, & August.

Program of Activities POA- Strategic Plan (30 pts): Students will submit the Strategic Plan, which takes the place of the preliminary POA document. FCAE District 3 Field Supervisor will be the guest lecturer to fulfill this class assignment.
