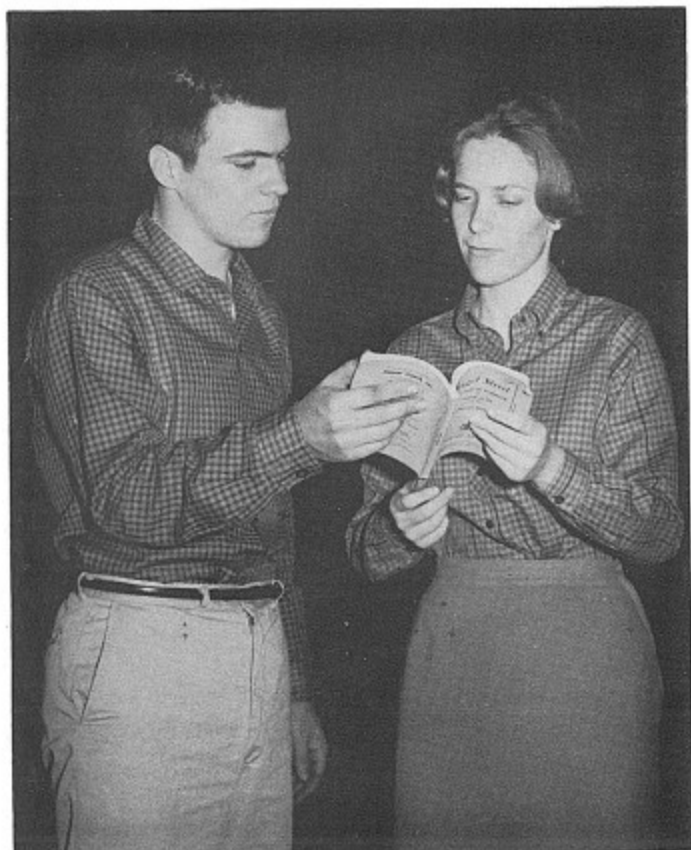
The school paper, the Spotlight, was published every two weeks by the members of the Senior English class. The paper featured school sports, activities, and editorials written by the staff members.

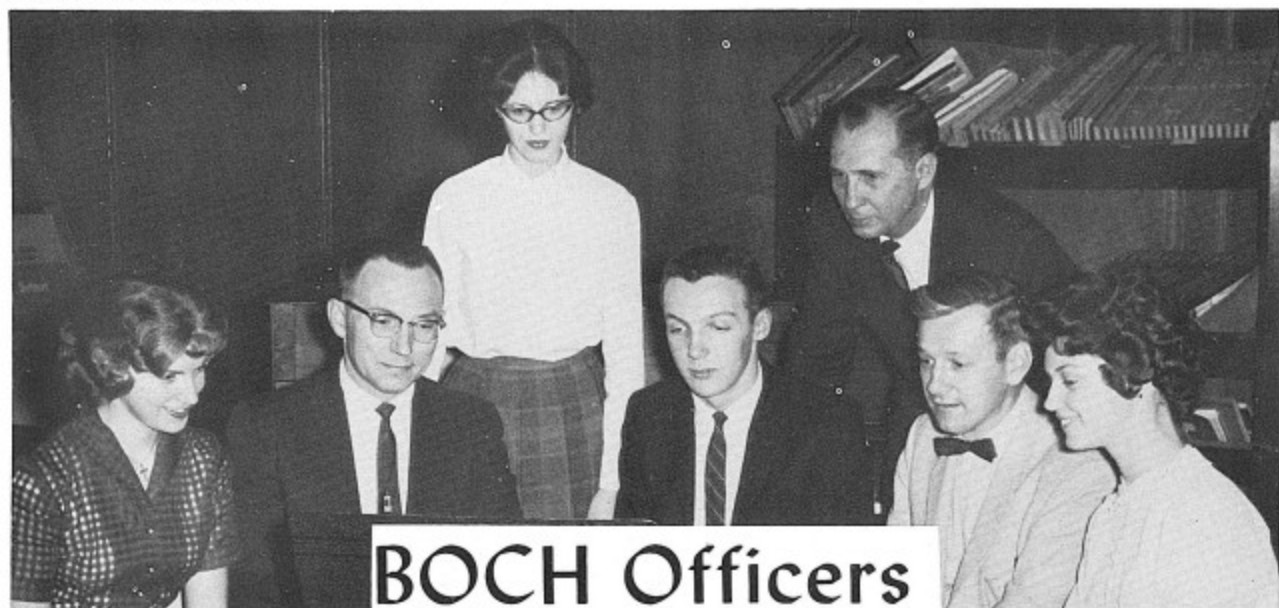

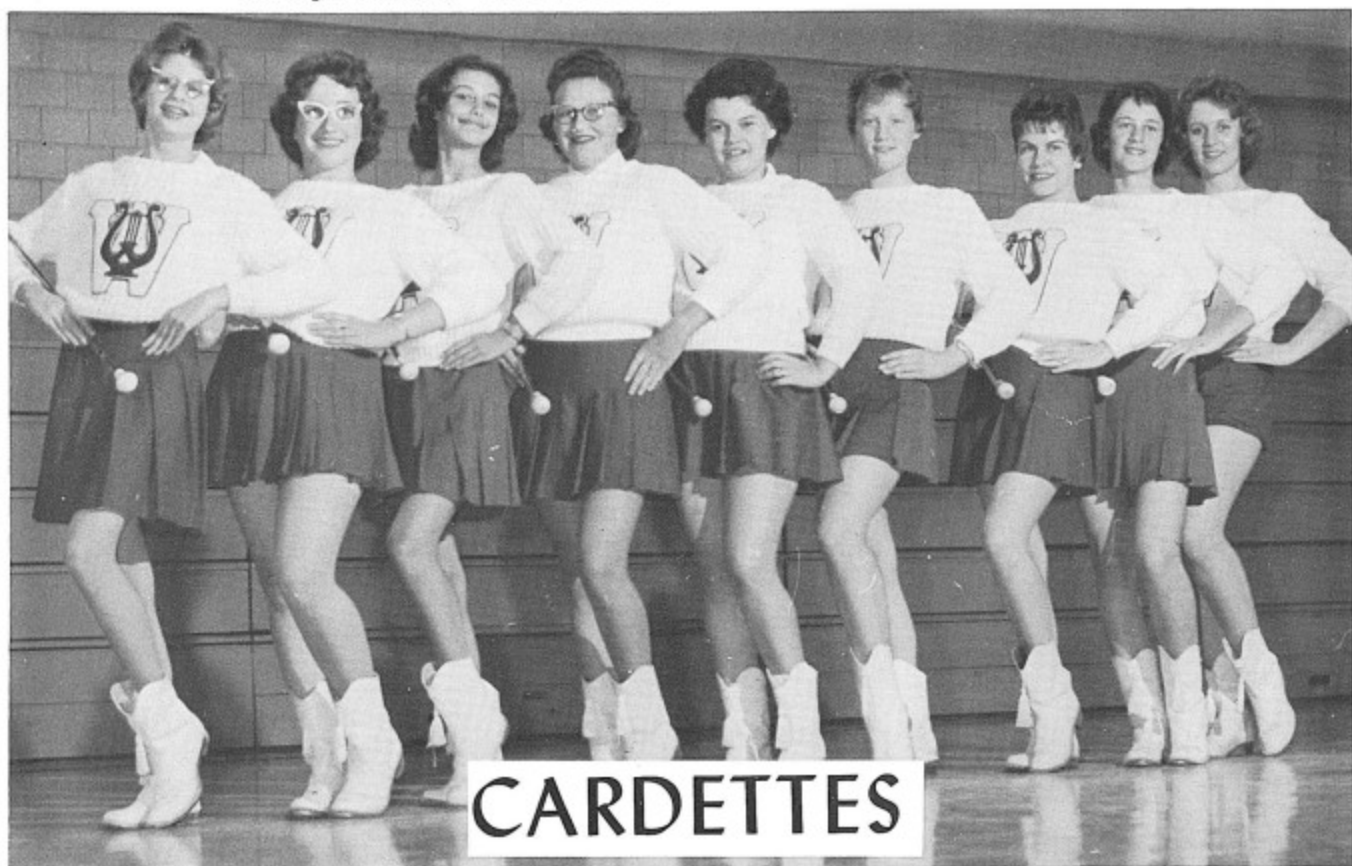
Music

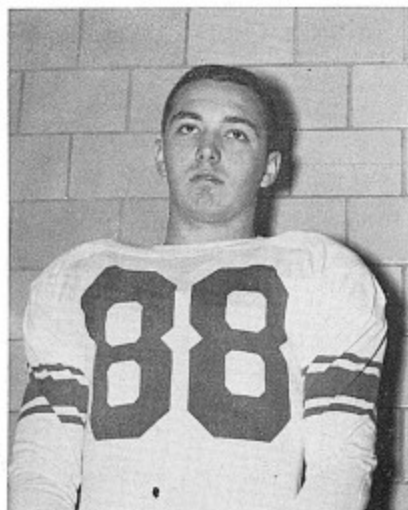
Outstanding Gridiron Graduates

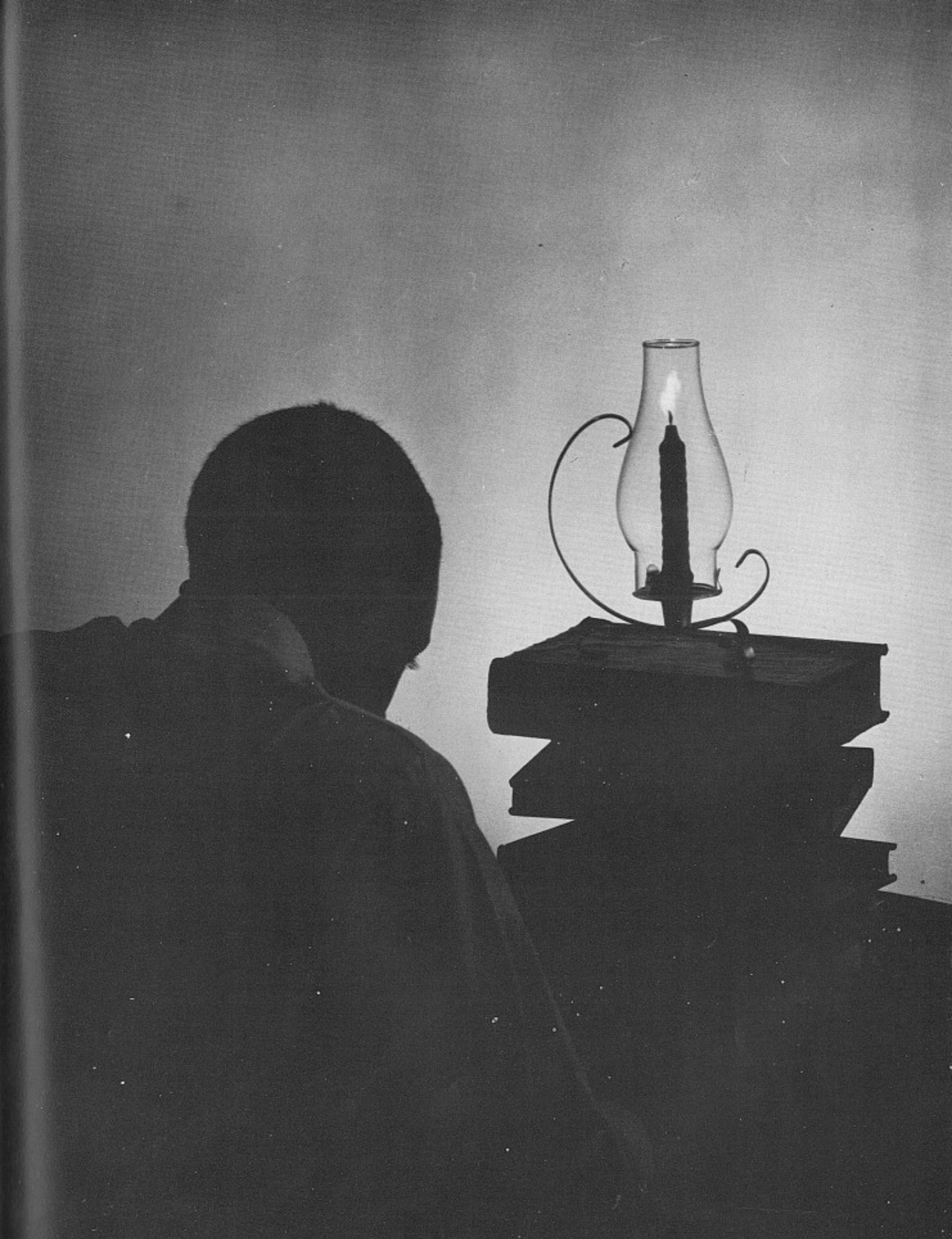
Every upper classman looks forward to the two main events of the spring---the Junior-Senior Prom and Graduation.

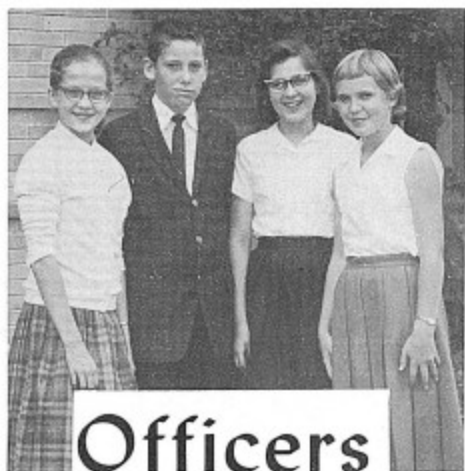
SEVENTH GRADE

Another project of the morning class was building a food store.

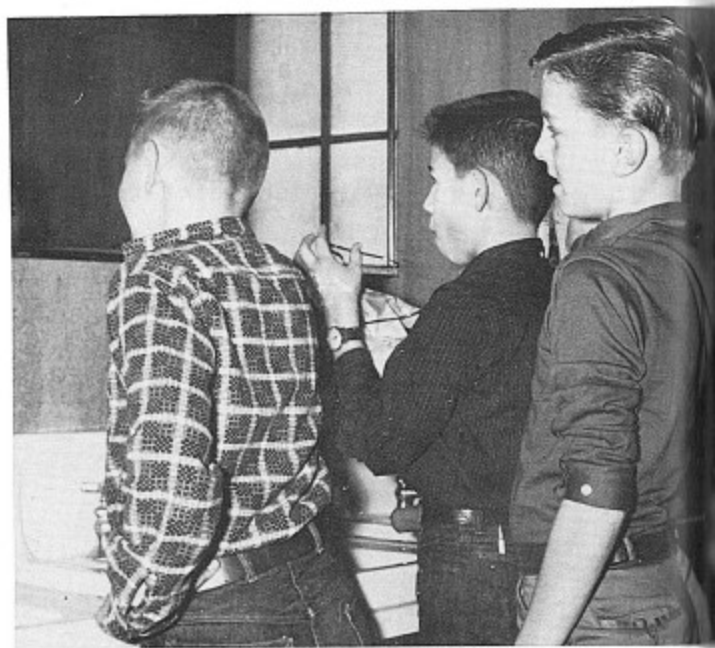
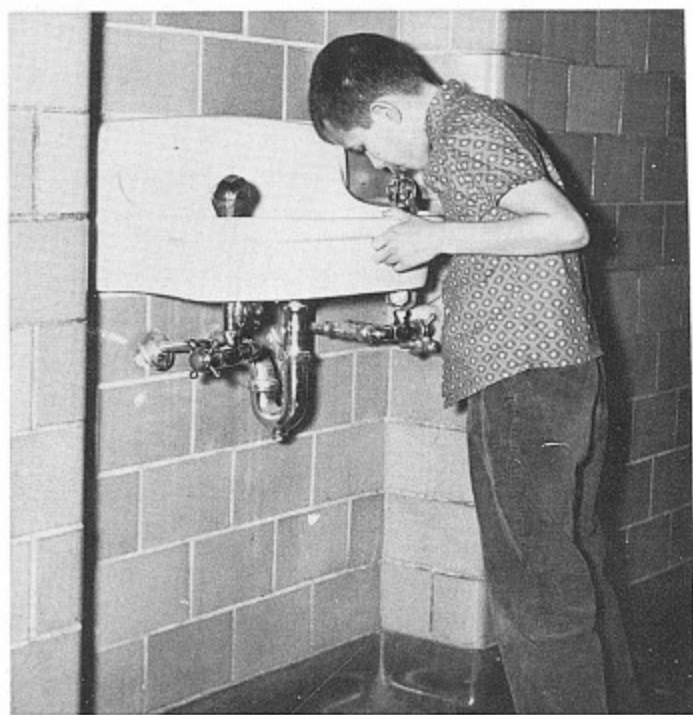
