Jordan Rouse, a senior History major at Western Illinois University and Macomb resident, has been named WIU's 2023-2024 Student Laureate of the Lincoln Academy of Illinois. Rouse's achievements stood out amongst a pool of impressive nominees.

Throughout his time at WIU, Rouse has been an outstanding leader, serving as president of multiple organizations, including the Inter-Hall Council, National Residence Hall Honorary and WIU Food Pantry. He has also maintained a 4.0 GPA as a member of the Centennial Honors College and held leadership positions in the WIU Phi Kappa Phi honor society, WIU Phi Alpha Theta history honor society and WIU Honors Council.

CENTENNIAL HONORS SCHOLARS

A Centennial Honors Scholar is a student in Western's Centennial Honors College who has completed Honors coursework and has achieved a grade point average of at least 3.40. These candidates wear a gold medallion on a light blue ribbon.

DEPARTMENTAL SCHOLARS

Departmental Scholars are the outstanding undergraduate degree candidates in an academic major as determined by the faculty in the major department. These candidates wear a gold medallion on a sapphire blue ribbon.

ACADEMIC DISTINCTION

Candidates for the baccalaureate degree, who have earned a minimum 60 semester hours of graded courses at Western, are eligible for graduation with academic distinction. Coursework completed at WIU, and all transferable hours, are calculated to determine honors. The academic distinction of Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.60-3.74 on a 4.00 scale. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a gold ribbon. The academic distinction of Magna Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.75-3.89. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a purple ribbon. The academic distinction of Summa Cum Laude is awarded to students with a grade point average of 3.90 or higher. These candidates wear a silver medallion on a red ribbon.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD RECIPIENTS

Scott D. Clarke, a 1981 political science graduate, is retired from the state of Illinois' Division of Banking. Clarke worked in the division for 35 years, the last 20 of which he served as assistant director. He was responsible for the regulation of state chartered and foreign banking offices and supervision of the state's bank examiners and the regulation of the largest number of banks of any state in the country and the regulation of more than \$7 trillion in assets.

Clarke has served on numerous commissions related to the oversight of the financial industry, including the Treasury Department's Bank Secrecy Act Committee, where he represented the nation's state banking regulators for regulation of money laundering and anti-terrorism financing. In addition, he was a member of the U.S. Secret Service Electronic Crimes Task Force, a member of the Board of Directors of the American Council of State Savings Supervisors and the Conference of State Bank Supervisors (CSBS). Clarke served as chair of the CSBS Committee, which set the accreditation standards of the nation's state banking departments. Additionally, he served as the chair of the Education Foundation of State Bank Supervisors, a non-profit foundation that oversees training for the nation's state banking regulators.

Clarke is a longtime volunteer for the American Red Cross, having served in various leadership roles, including the chair of the Illinois State Service Council. He currently serves as the American Red Cross liaison to Illinois State Government agencies and is actively involved in disaster response, including his previous assignment as the Red Cross representative at the Federal

Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) headquarters in Washington D.C. during catastrophic hurricanes. He has been the Red Cross representative for the Illinois Terrorism Task Force since its formation and has chaired several of its committees.

Clarke has received numerous awards, including the Illinois Jaycees Ten Outstanding Young Persons, the American Legion Auxiliary Award for Excellence in Citizenship, the American Red Cross Paragon Award and

the 2017 WIU Alumni Achievement Award. He is also a member of the Benefactors Level of the WIU Foundation Fellows.

Clarke is actively involved in recruiting and retaining Leathernecks. He can frequently be found at Discover Western open house programs, has a long track record of connecting prospective students with WIU and engages frequently with current students. Clarke regularly hosts Emergency Management students in Springfield to visit the State Emergency Operations Center. Clarke was appointed by Governors Rauner and Pritzker as a Commissioner of Volunteerism and Community Service. He also serves as the Treasurer of the Evanston Township High School Educational Foundation.

Through his philanthropic support of WIU, Clarke has endowed the Scott D. Clarke Excellence in Leadership Scholarship and has been a leader in the success of the annual Western Challenge Day of Giving. His advocacy work has also benefited WIU, as he has been instrumental in securing a substantial grant for the Emergency Operations Center. Clarke currently serves on the WIU Alumni Council.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD RECIPIENTS (CONTINUED)

Steven J. McCann, a 1978 accountancy graduate, was an assurance partner with RSM US LLP until his retirement in 2017, serving a variety of closely held and family-owned businesses. Since that time, he has remained employed with the firm on a part time basis as a senior advisor in the Business & Transition Advisory Services line of business.

McCann is a graduate of the RSM CFO Program through the University of Minnesota's Carlson School of Management, where he received training to more effectively advise CEOs and CFOs in essential areas, including strategy, operations, marketing, organizational behavior, leadership and change management.

McCann is a Certified Public Accountant. He is a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Illinois and Iowa Societies of Certified Public Accountants.

McCann has a decades-long history of serving the Quad Cities region on numerous non-profit boards, including stints as the chair of Gilda's Club and the John Deere Classic. He currently sits on the American

Red Cross Quad Cities and West Central Illinois Board of Directors and is president of the Board of Directors of Oakwood Country Club in Coal Valley, IL.

McCann's efforts have been recognized through multiple awards, including a Women's Connection Male Champion of Change, John Deere Classic Community Hero, WIU Accountancy Preferred Partner in Education, and the 2003 WIU Alumni Achievement Award. He is also a member of the Honors Level of the WIU Foundation Fellows.

McCann was involved in the development of the WIU-Quad Cities campus through his leadership on the Renew Moline Board of Directors. He currently serves on the WIU Foundation Board, where he is a member of both the executive and investment committees. McCann is a member of the WIU College of Business and Technology National Advisory Board, where he has served as chair since 2015. Additionally, McCann is the co-chair of the WIU-Quad Cities Planning Advisory Council and served as the Quad Cities community representative on the 2020 WIU Presidential Search Committee.

DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR

DR. RICHARD M. CANGRO



Originally from Staten Island, NY, Richard M. Cangro, Ph. D., is a Professor and Director of Music Education at Western Illinois University. He was formerly a public school band and orchestra director for 15 years in Connecticut, as well as a youth ensemble conductor and chamber music coach for the Hartt School Community Division, University of Hartford (West Hartford, CT). While teaching in Connecticut, he also worked for 10 years as an assessor for the Connecticut State Board of Education beginning teacher licensure program and was the professional development chair for the Connecticut Music Educators Association. Dr. Cangro received a Bachelor of Music in Trumpet Performance from the Manhattan School of Music, a Master of Music Education from the Hartt School, and a Ph.D. in Music Education also from Hartt. With his dissertation focusing on applying cooperative learning strategies to instrumental music learning, Dr. Cangro continues to investigate the nature and effects of student interaction at all levels of music learning. He served for several years on the executive board for the International Association for the Study of Cooperation in Education (IASCE).

A two-time Fulbright grant recipient, Dr. Cangro is active as a presenter, curriculum consultant, adjudicator, and conductor. He has presented workshops and sessions for several school district in-services and at numerous music educator conferences throughout the US. He has guest taught at universities in Turkey,

Thailand, Puerto Rico, Philippines, Pakistan, Ecuador, Canada, and China, and has presented professional development at events in Canada, China, England, Montenegro, Myanmar, Serbia, and Taiwan (ROC). His articles on music learning and teaching have been published in journals including *Applications of Research in Music Education*, *Selected Papers from the 6th International Symposium on Assessment in Music Education*, *American Music Teacher*, and *Music Educators Journal*.

Musically, Dr. Cangro has a wide range of performance experience as a trumpet player and conductor. He is a member of the Knox-Galesburg Symphony and the Jacksonville (IL) Symphony, performs with the Southeast Iowa Symphony, and has been an active orchestral player and chamber musician for over 30 years. He has conducted several school, festival, community, and adult ensembles, and is currently the music director/conductor of the Monmouth Civic Orchestra at Monmouth College and the Quincy Area Youth Orchestra.

At WIU, Dr. Cangro teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in music education, advises the collegiate music educators chapter, and supervises student teachers. He serves on several university committees and is the Midwest regional vice president of the national Phi Beta Delta International Honor Society, promoting and supporting internationalization efforts in the community. Dr. Cangro is the 2024 WIU Distinguished University Professor.

THE WESTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of university scholarship and integrity since the 11th century, is used to lead the academic procession at commencement and other special ceremonial occasions, signifying the importance of the event and the confirmation of the academic process.

The University's mace was designed by WIU Department of Art and Design Chair Kat Myers, and crafted by Myers in collaboration with the late Kenneth B. Epperson, Western alumnus and former WIU Admissions' community college director.

The turned walnut shaft is encircled by three engraved sterling silver bands with four pierced sterling silver fins cradling a freely moving gold sphere.



The fins represent Western Illinois University's four core values—Academic Excellence, Educational Opportunity, Personal Growth, and Social Responsibility—positioned as the four directions of the compass. The sphere, representing the student, is held and guided by the fins as it moves to find its place in the world.

The incorporated sphere was formed by raising, a 3,000-year-old metalsmithing process using steel hammers and forms to shape sheet metal. The sphere is made of 24K gold-plated brass. While the process was chosen as a representation of Western's respect for tradition, the sphere remains mobile, illustrating the University's readiness to adapt as it looks toward an ever-changing future.

ABOUT THE FLAGS

Displayed in the arena are the flags of 32 nations representing students in today's graduating class at Western Illinois University. The flags represent the following countries: Antigua, Australia, Bangladesh, Barbados, Brazil, Cameroon, Canada, China, Columbia, Croatia, Dominica, France, Germany, Ghana, Grenada, India, Jamaica, Jordan, Kosovo, Mongolia, Nepal, Nigeria, Philippines, Romania, Russia, Spain, Sri Lanka, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, Sweden, United Kingdom and the United States.

Western Illinois University was home to students from 58 countries during the Spring 2024 semester.

ABOUT THE GONFALONS

Gonfalons made their inaugural appearance in Western's Fall 2009 Commencement ceremonies. The gonfalons are banners hung from a crossbar on poles, which represent the specific group immediately following the gonfalonier, the person carrying the banner.

Their origins date back to medieval Italy, when gonfalons were used to distinguish Italian republics. They have also been used in ecclesiastical processions, as well as in war; and they have evolved into bearing coats of arms for individuals and groups.

Many universities and colleges have adopted the use of gonfalons to enhance the ceremonial nature of commencement exercises.

Today's processions include gonfalons for Western Illinois University, the School of Graduate Studies, the Centennial Honors College, University Libraries and each of the four academic colleges: Arts and Sciences; Business and Technology; Education and Human Services; and Fine Arts and Communication.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The colorful regalia worn by academicians is steeped in tradition, dating back to the ecclesiastical garb of the Middle Ages. Adaptations from ecclesiastical to academic dress began in early European universities, which were founded by the church. University faculty and students wore the adapted robes for distinction and warmth. The University of Cambridge is cited as the first to use the academic gown.

Representatives of American universities met in the early 1890s and agreed upon a standard style of academic attire. The Intercollegiate Code, revised in 1932, and again in 1959, is followed today by American colleges and universities, except for a few schools, which continue to use the styles of England.

Gowns are traditionally black. However, some universities have authorized use of a color symbolic of the institution. Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves and are designed to be worn closed. Master's and Specialist gowns have long, closed sleeves with an arc near the bottom and an opening for the arm. Doctoral gowns are faced with wide velvet panels and have bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal velvet bars.

Caps, originally round, are typically square mortarboards. Some universities have adopted a doctor's cap with a soft crown instead of the mortarboard.

ACADEMIC REGALIA (CONTINUED)

At Western, the tassel color of bachelor degree candidates indicates the college or program from which students graduate: College of Arts and Sciences, white for bachelor of arts, gold for bachelor of science, white and gold for bachelor of liberal arts and sciences, and apricot for bachelor of science in nursing; College of Business and Technology, sapphire blue; College of Education and Human Services, light blue for bachelor of science and bachelor of science in education, and citron for bachelor of social work; College of Fine Arts and Communication, brown for bachelor of arts, bachelor of fine arts, and bachelor of science, and pink for bachelor of music; General Studies Degree Program, white for bachelor of arts; and Interdisciplinary Studies, white for bachelor of arts and gold for bachelor of science. Master's tassels are black. Doctoral tassels are old gold.

Hoods, which originally were attached to the gown and could be slipped over the head for warmth, are the most colorful articles of specialist, master's, and doctor's clothing. The color of the lining of the hood represents the university awarding the degree. The color of the facing of the hood reflects the academic discipline of the wearer's highest degree. At Western, the colors awarded for doctoral and graduate degrees are: light blue, education doctorate, education specialist, master of arts in teaching, and master of science in education; gold, specialist in school psychology and master of science; sapphire blue, master of accountancy and master of business administration; white, master of arts; white and gold, master of liberal arts and sciences; pink, master of music and master of public health; and brown, master of fine arts.

Colors which may be seen among the marching faculty and their corresponding fields of study include: brown (fine arts), crimson (journalism), dark blue (philosophy), golden yellow (science), lemon yellow (library science), light blue (education), yellow brown (commerce, business, accountancy), pink (music), purple (law), sage green (physical education), scarlet (theology), gold and white (liberal arts and sciences), and white (arts, letters, humanities).

INFORMATION FOR DEGREE CANDIDATES

Undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to participate in Commencement if they anticipate completion of requirements for graduation during the spring or summer semester.

The roster of candidates listed in this program is a compilation of those eligible to participate and who have not submitted the Exclusion of Directory Information Form. It should not be construed either as a complete or official list of those who will receive a University degree. Due to publishing deadlines, names of some degree recipients may not appear, while names of degree candidates may appear even though they have not completed their degree requirements.

Undergraduate honors distinctions are based on the candidate's academic record at the time of publication.

Diplomas will be mailed approximately eight weeks after Commencement to those who have completed requirements and have no University encumbrances.

The University has arranged for a professional photographer to take individual photographs as students cross the stage. A postcard with the link to the commencement photo galleries will be mailed to the student's home address within 7-14 days of the ceremony. Photographs may be ordered from the website.

The University's official registry for conferral of degrees is the Office of the Registrar.

HISTORY OF WESTERN

On April 24, 1899, a bill to establish Western Illinois University (then called Western Illinois State Normal School) was passed by the state legislature. Macomb was selected in 1900 as the location for the new normal school in west central Illinois, and on Tuesday, September 23, 1902, Western Illinois State Normal School opened its doors for the first official day of classes on the new campus.

In 1921, the General Assembly changed the name of Western Illinois State Normal School to Western Illinois State Teachers College, and in 1947, the school was renamed Western Illinois State College. Ten years later, the school became Western Illinois University. Illinois Gov. William G. Stratton approved the change July 5, 1957, and Western began its transformation into a university.

Today, Western offers numerous undergraduate and graduate degree programs, as well as two doctoral programs and several post-baccalaureate certificate programs, and is comprised of the main campus in Macomb, IL, and the urban Quad Cities campus in Moline, IL.
